Representative Town Meeting (RTM)

The RTM is the legislative body of the Town. It consists of 230 members elected by the voters in the Town's 12 districts. RTM delegates must be registered voters, run on a non-partisan basis, serve without compensation, and are elected for a 2-year term. The RTM's functions and responsibilities are set forth in the Town Charter. The RTM adopts the Town budget, approves interim appropriations over \$5,000, appoints members to boards and commissions upon nominations by the Selectmen, acts as the final planning authority on municipal improvements, and initiates and passes ordinances.

RTM meetings are open to the public. To find out your district and who your RTM representatives are, or for further information about the RTM, consult the Greenwich RTM Directory, published by the League of Women Voters and available at local libraries, or in the Town Clerk's office, or you can visit the RTM website.

Board of Selectmen
Two meetings per month. Call 203 622-7710 for dates.

Board of Assessment Appeals
Meets in March and September unless the Assessor requests an extension.

Board of Estimate and Taxation (BET)
Meets the third Monday of each month except January and September. Town Hall Meeting Room at 6:30 p.m.

Board of Education
