Have you ever thought about getting more involved? Or wanted to share your opinions? Or simply wished you were better informed?

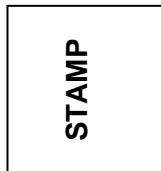

A grass-roots organization

- A non-partisan, political organization that encourages informed and active participation in government and influences public policy through education and advocacy.
- Founded in 1920 as an outgrowth of the 72-year struggle to win voting rights for women.
- A multi-issue organization that operates at local, state and national levels.
- An activist group, which *does not support or oppose any political party or candidate*. It *does* take stands on issues.

Addresses the issues

Takes action

- Reports results of careful research to members, policy makers, and the public.
- Lobbies government officials at all levels for League positions established by study, discussion, and consensus of members.

Gets Out the Vote!

- Encourages citizen participation in government and the electoral process through voter registration, voter guides, and candidate debates.
- Assists in the election of Residents' Councils in Greenwich housing developments.
